
## Monarch Butterfly

## Stages of Metamorphosis

- A female butterfly lays an egg on a plant that will be a food source once the egg hatches.
- Egg hatches and caterpillar emerges. The caterpillar is the larval stage of the life cycle.
- Monarch larva eats milkweed leaves while Painted Lady larva eats thistles or daisies. As larva grows it sheds its exoskeleton (old skin) multiple times.
- After about two weeks the larva is fully grown and searches for a place to transform into a chrysalis.
- Larva finds a safe location to attach itself.
- Larva sheds its exoskeleton for the last time and begins to show its cuticle (new skin) as it enters the pupal stage.
- Chrysalis (pupal stage) is fully formed and metamorphosis occurs as the larva turns into a butterfly.
- Adult butterfly becomes visible while still inside the chrysalis.
- Butterfly emerges from the chrysalis and spreads its wings
- Adult butterfly flies from flower to flower feeding on nectar. Adults mate and then females lay eggs as the cycle begins again.
